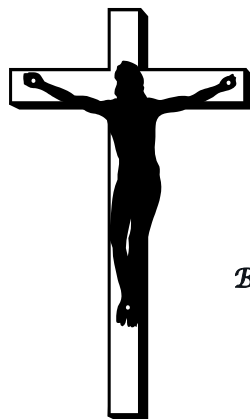
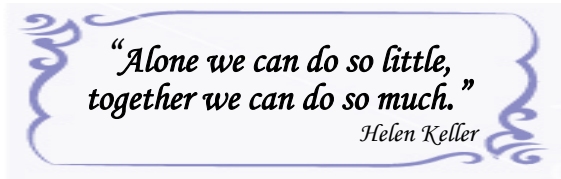


Prayer to Our Lady of Good Counsel
